

RAMSGATE FISHING-BOAT LOST.

After having had over 40 smacks sunk by the enemy during the war, the Ramsgate fishing industry has suffered another loss, that of the motor-vessel Impulse, which is believed to have been blown up by a submerged mine. No trace of the crew has been found, but fragmentary remains of the vessel have been landed by the sailing fishing vessel Era, which reported hearing a violent explosion near the Tongue Lightship early on Saturday morning. The victims, all married men, are Daniel Wynheer, William Revell, Harry Bushell, and William Blay.



HMS HAWKE

Charles W. Crockford Petty Officer 1/Class CH/198167

On 15 October 1914 Hawke was torpedoed by German submarine U-9. The submarine's first torpedo hit Hawke, igniting a magazine and causing a tremendous explosion which ripped much of the ship apart. Hawke sank in a few minutes with the loss of her captain, 26 officers and 497 men; only 70 of her 594 crew survived. Chatham Naval Memorial

William Appleton Jnr: Possibly **APPLETON**, William James Charles Died 2.4.1916 age 43 Faversham Munitions Factory Explosion

47 Avenue Road Ramsgate : Wife – Mary A Appleton

At around lunch-time on Sunday, 2nd April 1916 a serious fire broke out at gunpowder works at Faversham which led to a number of explosions completely destroying five munitions buildings. The actual number of lives lost by the explosion (the series of explosions is usually referred to as a single explosion) is uncertain.

George H Chittenden 1 Bethseda Street Ramsgate: Seaman S.S."Oriole (London) Died 30.1.1915 age 37: Oriole SS was a 1,489grt British Merchant steamer built in 1914 by Ailsa Shipbuilding Company for the General Steam Navigation Co. She was powered by steam triple expansion engine giving 12.5 knots. On the 30th January 1915 when on route from London for Le-Havre she was torpedoed by German submarine U-28 and sunk E of the Straits of Dover. 21 lives lost including the Master.

The British steamship Oriole, of the General Steam Navigation Company, which left London on January 29, was due at Havre the following day. She has not arrived, nor is there any news of her whereabouts except that two lifebuoys marked S.S. Oriole were picked up near Rye last Saturday. There is grave reason to fear that she may have fallen a victim to the German submarine which torpedoed the Tokomaru and Ikaria. She carried a mercantile crew of 21 hands all told.

RAMSGATE FISHING BOAT SUNK.

Edward Longley, second hand of the Ramsgate fishing boat Elsie, arrived home on Sunday and reported that his vessel was sunk in collision with the Norwegian steamer Hecla, four miles off Dungeness, in a thick fog on Friday evening. The Elsie was cut in two, and James Solly, the skipper, and James Burke third hand, were drowned. Longley was in the water clinging to the floating hatchway for half an hour when he was picked up by the steamer's lifeboat.

HMS Aboukir was spotted by the German submarine U-9, commanded by Kapitänleutnant Otto Weddigen. Although they were

not zigzagging, all of the ships had lookouts posted to search for periscopes and one gun on each side of each ship was manned. Weddigen ordered his submarine to submerge and closed the range to the unsuspecting British ships. At close range, he fired a single torpedo at Aboukir. The torpedo broke her back, and she sank within 20 minutes with the loss of 527 men

Possibly - Fireman"Shafopear" age 49 Died 29.4.1919 La Rochelle, France of a brain haemorrhage.

Alfred (John) Whorlow 2nd Mate S.S. "Llwyngwair" (Swansea) Born Ramsgate Died 26.4.1918 age 28 when vessel was sunk by a torpedo.

The **LLWYNGWAIR** was in ballast on passage from Dunkirk for Newcastle-upon-Tyne on 26 April 1918, under the command of Captain J. Stevenson, when she was torpedoed and sunk by the German submarine UC-64. The vessel was struck amidships at 12.10 a.m. and the explosion killed eight of her crew of eighteen. Another vessel, the steamship ABBAS, had already sighted the the U-boat on the surface and fired her deck gun, forcing the submarine to submerge. However, she came too late to save the LLWYNGWAIR, which went down to the bottom soon after the engagement. The ABBAS picked up the ten survivors and landed them at Sunderland.
